


Time & Clock Questions - Grade 2 Part 1

Fun and challenging math questions for young students





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

Question 2

The cousins did not want to wake up! Grace finally got them out of bed at 6:20, which is 40 minutes later than their usual wake up time. When is their usual wake up time?

Question 3

Ava delivered 4 boxes of lemons to a supermarket 10 minutes before four in the afternoon. At what time did she deliver the lemons to the supermarket?

Question 4

Samuel put the turkey in the oven at 3 PM and took it out at 6:30 PM. How long did it take to cook?

Question 5

Alex's guests were at his house at 6:00 in the evening and stayed for 4 hours. When did the guests leave?

Question 6

Liam started mowing the lawn at 10 o'clock in the morning. Mrs. Smith was supposed to come home at 2:15. How long did Liam expect to mow the lawn for?

Question 7

The mailman was scheduled to arrive at the house at 1:30 in the afternoon, but he was delayed due to a flat tire. The mailman arrived at the house at 2:00 in the afternoon. How late was John?

Question 8

The conference was delayed for 20 minutes. The conference lasted for 40 minutes and ended at three o'clock. When was the conference's original start time?

Question 9

On Tuesday, Jacob used three hours to mow his lawn starting from 8:00 in the morning. When was he done mowing his lawn?

Question 10

It took John 20 minutes to bike to the park from his apartment. He left his apartment at 10:40 AM. At what time did John arrive at the park?
